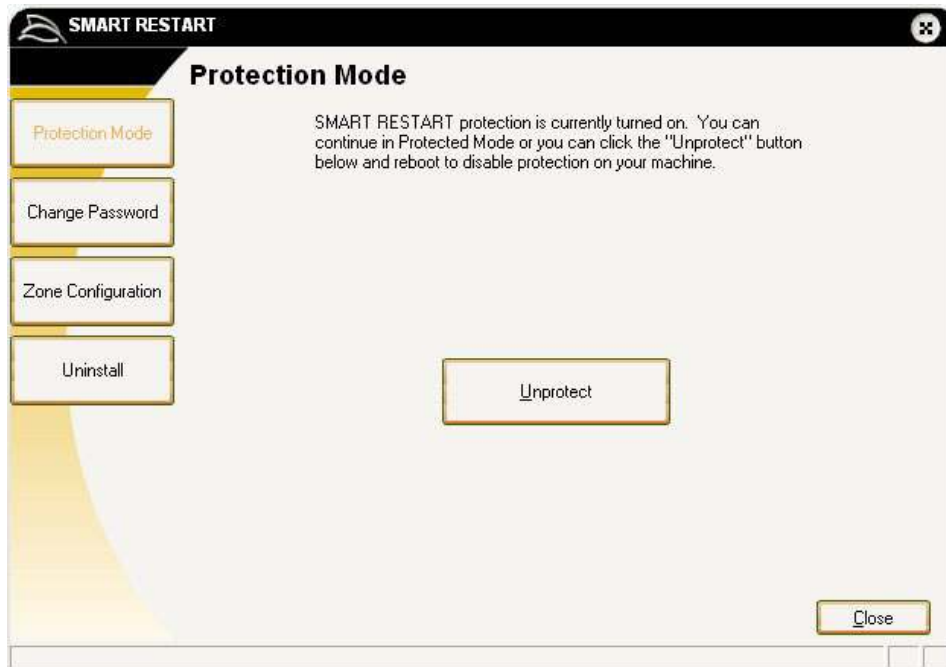


How to run Windows Updates

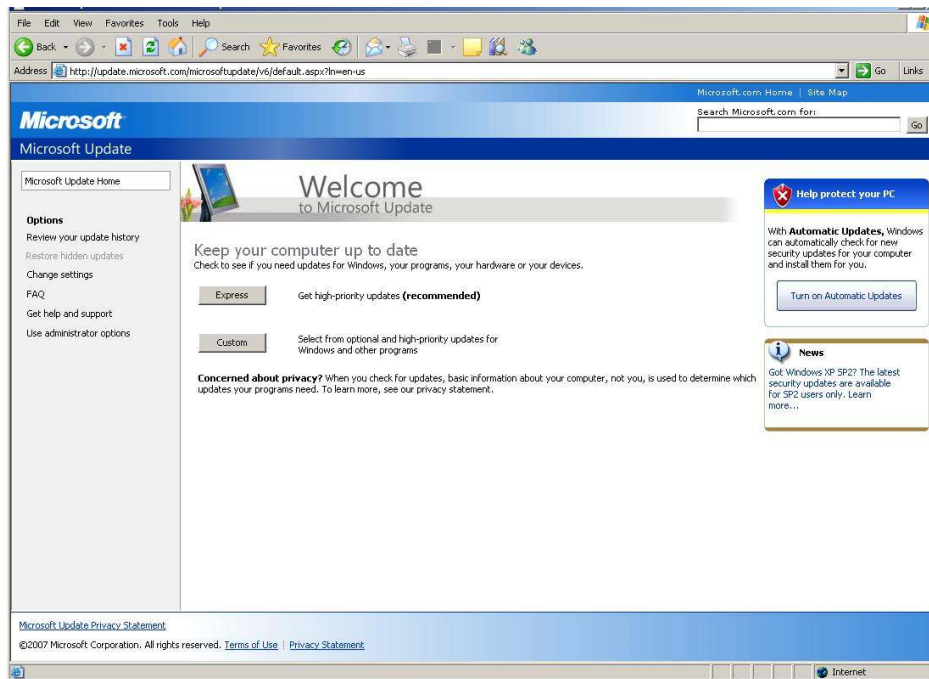
Once SMART RESTART™ is installed, all files in the Protected Zone are unable to be modified while Protection is turned ON. The files in the Protected Zone include files that are modified during Windows Updates. If you install Windows Updates with Protection turned ON, those updates will be stored in the Temporary Zone and then erased when the machine is restarted.

The below steps will guide you through adding Windows Updates to the Protected Zone

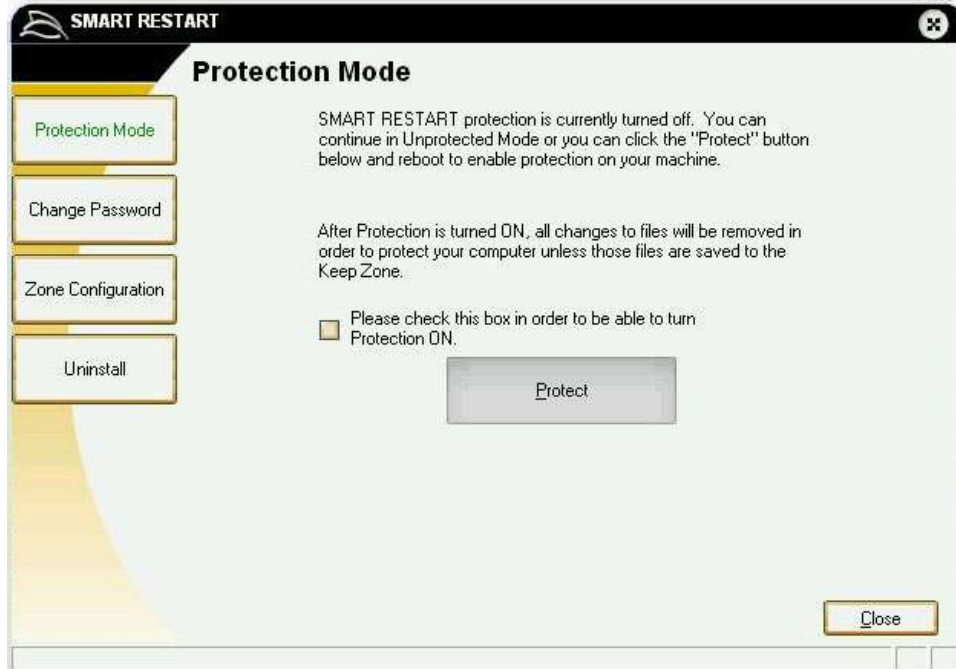
1. **Turn Protection Off** - To ensure that the Windows Updates are placed in the Protected Zone, you must turn SMART RESTART™ Protection OFF. To do this, click on the “Unprotect” button on the screen shown below and then restart the computer.



2. **Run Windows Update** – You can download any needed Windows Update by going to update.microsoft.com. Follow the Windows Instructions to run the update process.



3. **Turn Protection ON** – Once Windows Updates have been successfully installed, they are then part of the Protected Zone. You can now turn SMART RESTART™ Protection ON. To do this, check the check box to enable the “Protect” button on the screen shown below. Then click the “Protect” button and restart the computer.



Due to the highly protective design of SMART RESTART™, turning off protection is required to make any changes to the Protected Zone, where Windows Updates reside. Having to modify Protection Status to make changes to the Protected Zone allows you full security control over your computer and prohibits anyone else from making unwanted changes to your machine.
